TODDLER study

We are looking for **healthy boys under four years old** to take part in a research study from home.

TODDLER is a study of boys with a rare, life-limiting, muscle disease called **Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD)**. We need to find a good way to measure motor function (ability to move) in young boys with this condition. This is important because we need good measures to monitor progress and test new medicines.



Our aim is to find the best way to measure movement in young boys.

There are no drugs being tested in this study, but the findings could help test drugs in future to **help improve the lives of young boys with muscle disease.**



WE ARE LOOKING FOR:

- ✓ Healthy boys
- ✓ 1–3 years old
- ✓ Able to walk 10 metres without help



WE NEED HEALTHY CONTROL PARTICIPANTS



TAKING PART WILL INVOLVE:



Your son wearing a little watch-like device on his ankles during the daytime for three recording periods over 6 months. He can go about his normal daily activities. The wearable device records walking movements (gait) but does not track location.



Appointments to check in with you will be by phone or online. **No travelling or visits to hospital!**



Sharing basic information about your son's medical history to check he can participate.



Completing a questionnaire about your experience of the wearable device.
