TODDLER study:

We are looking for young boys with **Duchenne muscle dystrophy (DMD)** under four years old to take part in this study from home.

Treating younger boys with DMD could help improve their lives. However, without good measures we cannot test medicines in young boys with DMD.

Our aim is to find the best way to measure movement in young boys with DMD.



There are no drugs being tested in this study, but the findings could **help test effective drugs to treat DMD earlier in the future.**



WE ARE LOOKING FOR:

- ✓ boys with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy
- ✓ 1–3 years old
- ✓ able to walk 10 metres without help.

TAKING PART WILL INVOLVE:



Your son wearing a little watch-like device on his ankles during the daytime for three recording periods over 6 months. He can go about his normal daily activities. The wearable device records walking movements (gait) but does not track location.



6 appointments over ~7 months by phone, online or in your home.



Two home visits from our physiotherapist to test your son's movements and development.



Sharing information about your son's medical history and completing questionnaires about his abilities, quality of life, and your experience of using the wearable device.
